1. Changes to Agenda
2. Approval of September 16, 2014 minutes – Humphrey suggested adding that there was a viewing of the video “How do you say Sequim” . Motion to approve with that addition Patsy/Linda. Motion Carried.
3. Correspondence. KKR distributed letter from Traveling Lantern Theatre Company which will be saved for future reference.
4. Unfinished Business
  - a. Application process/form – S. Humphrey update

The application process/forms were approved by the Commission. The commission would like to obtain City Council approval so they can begin soliciting potential art for the new Civic Center.

b. Town Hall Meeting

The purpose of the meeting would be to introduce the Arts Commission to various arts organizations. The Community Foundation may follow up on a formal coordination between all arts groups. It was agreed to wait until after January to have the meeting. Sharon will let the foundation know.

c. Civic Center

i. Review exhibit space

The commission reviewed the recap of room/wall dimensions for the civic center. They established priorities identifying those areas that they would like to see ready for the opening of the civic center. They discussed potential art for various areas. The Commission recommends rotating art in some areas. Some areas will require procurement of new art pieces.

There was agreement that they would like to see the City's currently owned pieces. KKR will set up a tour of City offices to view those pieces.

They discussed getting the writing community involved by creating captions for the historical prints to be placed in the Civic Center. They agreed to place a Priority #3 on certain areas to see how these areas are used and determine what may be suitable. "Loaned" art could possibly be placed in the interim.

Sharon will update the recap for distribution to the group and City Council. It was suggested to contact Katherine Vollenweider as she put the photos together at the Gazette.

Steven agreed to work on this project.

It was agreed the Commission would like to tour the civic center when the drywall is up.

The bronze sculptures could be used inside the civic center as placeholders.

ii. Plaza Proposal

The plaza is still in the design phase. The Commission agreed they would like to see the Centennial tiles incorporated into the plaza design. It should be a wall display.

iii. Statement piece

The architects have indicated they plan for a statement piece at Sequim and Cedar Streets.

5. New Business

a. Review and Discuss Work Plan

The Commission discussed items they will need to work on in the future. Ann Soule will be invited to the next meeting to discuss her ideas for incorporating art with stormwater.

Steven and Patsy will work with the Community Foundation on funding options.

6. Jerry Owie

Jerry is new to town and wanted the Commission to be aware of him and his work. It was suggested he become involved with the arts organizations in town.
