## Public Works Summer Projects Begin

Summer is quickly approaching and the City of Sequim Public Works Department is hard at work preparing for a busy summer schedule. Some of the major projects you'll see this year include:



- Washington Street sidewalk upgrades—bring corner and driveway ramps up to Americans with Disabilities Act standards (**Transportation Benefit District Project**)
- Sequim Avenue between Washington and Hammond—replace a water main and an asphalt overlay of the roadway
- N .7<sup>th</sup> between Washington and Fir Streets—repave and upgrade sidewalk ramps (**Transportation Benefit District Project**)
- Fir Street and Sequim Avenue—intersection study and improvements (**Transportation Benefit District Project**)
- Olympic Discovery Trail—define bicycle and pedestrian paths between Blake and Sequim Avenues (**Transportation Benefit District Project**)
- North Rhodefer Road—chip seal the road surface
- West Sequim Bay Road—repave and correct damage caused by utility installations
- Carrie Blake Park—realign entrance to move it away from the playground
